## NEA-Retired Delegate Elections and OEA-Retired Advisory Council Elections

The **OEA-Retired election for Spring 2020** is being conducted by Election America. Online voting opens on March 1, 2020, and closes on March 30, 2020, at 5:00 p.m. (eastern).

Election notices will be mailed (and emailed, if on file) to OEA-Retired members with an individual Election Code and Voting PIN (you will need these to vote). The Ohio NEA-R delegation consists of nine delegate seats, the Chair, Mary Benegar, is a delegate by virtue of office. There are 23 candidates running for the remaining 8 seats. Ten candidates are from NEOEA; one from Capital; two from Central; two from ECOEA; one from EOEAE; one from NCOEA; two from SWOEA; and four from WOEAE.

Two candidates are running for the **OEA-R At-Large Representative position on the OEA-R Advisory Council** with a term beginning September 1, 2020 and ending July 14, 2023: **Beverly A Woolridge, NEOEA; and Jane Rahn, WOEAE.**

I am beginning this Board of Directors Report with TWO OEA CALLS TO ACTION!!!! Your presence is needed to help make a difference. Strength through unity and numbers can be very powerful!

**Wednesday, March 18, 2020.** You are requested to assemble at the Statehouse in downtown Columbus for a statewide **Educator Red for Ed Rally** set to begin at 3:00 pm. This is not just for OEA members but for all who support public education and are impacted by current state legislation which is making their jobs challenging. This Rally will include administrators, Board of Education members, parents fighting Ed Choice, etc. For more specific details which are still being finalized, please check the OEA website for updates at [www.ohea.org](http://www.ohea.org) closer to the date.

**Wednesday, March 25, 2020.** Please join active and student OEA members from across Ohio to participate in an **OEA Lobby Day**. Make appointments with your legislators beginning now for that day. Begin your day at the OEA Building at 9:00 AM for a briefing on the current status of issues to be discussed. Then walk down to the Statehouse for your appointments.

Retirees are needed to actively participate in both of these events due to our historical perspective on issues we have faced during our careers. OEA-R members frequently say “we have retired from our position but never from our profession. We are committed to whatever we can do to continue to support the preservation of PUBLIC EDUCATION!” These are opportunities to do just that!

ALL OEA members, including retirees, are strongly encouraged to consider donating to the **OEA Fund for Children and Public Education (FCPE)**. There is the capability to make a one-time donation or a continuing donation just like payroll deduction during active years.

The Board of Directors held their Annual Winter Retreat and Board meeting last weekend. We had a staff person from NEA

with us Friday night and Saturday as we began working on establishing a strategic priority on racial and social justice. The NEA Trainer will be returning for our March meeting as we continue this important work and awareness. On Saturday afternoon the Board traveled to the Family Mentor Foundation in Columbus where 2,325 “buddy boxes” to feed area students who face weekend food shortages were assembled. This was followed by a group dinner with both afternoon/evening activities affording opportunities to interact socially and get to know each other better. The Board meeting was held on Sunday.

Also from the OEA Board:

The stipend for OEA-R Delegates to the NEA-R Annual Business Meeting and RA in Atlanta this summer has been set at \$2136. State at Large actives will receive \$1624.

There was also a unanimous vote by the BOD to support the potential ballot issue regarding increasing the Ohio minimum wage. This will not only help 1.4 million workers in Ohio but will be a catalyst to help increase the wages of our ESP members.

## Form a Retired Chapter at Your Former Local

Sample local constitution and bylaws language for retired members and a local retired organizing committee.

### Constitution

Article – Membership Section. Any person who has retired under one of the state retirement systems from a local association bargaining unit position and is not otherwise eligible for active membership shall be considered a “retired” member. Retired members are not eligible to vote or hold office, but may serve on association committees and may attend association events as provided in the bylaws.

Section. All members, including retired members, shall abide by the Code of Ethics of the Education Profession.

### Bylaws

Article - Dues, Membership And Expulsion Section. Retired members may attend association events; and upon paying annual local dues of one-third the local active dues, may serve on association committees.

Article - Association Committees  
There shall be the following standing committees:

Retired Organizing Committee – plans and conducts fundraising and other events for access retirees, guests, and other access members and maintains communication with access retirees. Retired members of the retired organizing committee may vote on committee business and hold office within the committee. The chairperson of the retired organizing committee will be a non-voting member of the executive committee.
