Join us for this special webinar hosted by the NEOEA Professional Development Committee: *Create to Understand: Arts Integration in Action* by Caroline Lorimer, a Visual Art Teacher, Working Artist & Arts Integration Specialist.

This webinar is an interactive online arts integration workshop designed to leave teachers with a clear, practical plan for quickly and easily incorporating the arts into their classrooms.

Arts integration is a research-based instructional approach that intentionally connects dance, music, theatre, and visual arts with core academic subjects such as science, math, and language arts. Through this approach, students construct and demonstrate understanding through creative processes while meeting learning goals in both the art form and the academic content area.



This workshop will focus on making meaningful classroom connections using visual art and creative movement. Arts integration promotes higher-order thinking, deepens engagement, and brings learning to life—especially for students who may struggle with more traditional instructional methods.

Caroline Lorimer is a licensed PK-12 visual art educator and arts integration specialist with a Master's in Education from Johns Hopkins University, focusing on Mind, Brain & Teaching. She has extensive experience designing and implementing arts-integrated curriculum, coaching teachers, and leading professional development. Caroline's work bridges creativity and research-based strategies to engage students and educators, fostering meaningful learning experiences through the power of the arts.
